Deputy County Counsel positions are designated as unclassified, and as such, are at-will employees serving at the will of the County Counsel.

Litigation services include the full range of civil defense and prosecution activities, from investigation through trial and appeal. Practices include appearances in State and Federal court, the Courts of Appeal and before administrative bodies.
