Public Health Educator



San Joaquin County Public Health Services is recruiting for dynamic and motivated Public Health Educators to fill current and future vacancies in Public Health Programs. There is currently one position in the Health Promotion and Chronic Disease Prevention Unit. The Unit works to improve the public's health through the Breastfeeding Initiative, Child Passenger Safety Program, Diabetes Prevention Program, Network for a Healthy California Program, Public Information and Communication, and the Smoking and Tobacco Outreach/Prevention Program (STOPP). This position will support chronic disease prevention efforts (e.g., built environment, tobacco prevention, air quality improvement, obesity prevention, etc.) to promote change at the policy, systems and environmental levels in order to reduce the burden of chronic disease in San Joaquin County.

Public Health Services

The Public Health Services campus is located in Stockton, CA. The health department provides a culturally diverse community (685,660) with classic public health services.

The Department has a tradition of strong community involvement and leadership in health promotion.

Become a Public Health Educator

The Public Health Educator coordinates with agency staff to assess and identify community public health educational needs; plans, organizes, implements and evaluates appropriate programs and services designed to meet the needs of public and private organizations, schools, community groups and the general public; monitors project plans, budgets and timelines; researches data and prepares copy for various reports, bulletins, periodicals, pamphlets and other written informational and educational presentations; prepares news releases and special features for all news media; and informs and interprets the various programs and services provided by Public Health to the general public, community organizations and other agencies.
