

The ideal candidate will also have a strong foundation and understanding of legal research methods and effectively articulate proceedings before administrative bodies.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITES

- Renders legal advice to Human Services social workers and other staff regarding a variety of civil matters where the custody and protection of children becomes a legal issues;
- Researches and analyzes existing laws and regulations, court decisions, pending legislation and a variety of other legal material related to wardship, dependency, adoption, placement and related issues;
- Prepares and reviews briefs, memoranda, opinions and pleadings in a variety of civil matters involving children;
- Represents Human Services Agency in court and before administrative bodies; examines and cross-examines witnesses; presents oral arguments;
- Attends public agency meetings as legal representative; explains legal requirements and restrictions to agency members;
- Coordinates with the District Attorney's Office on cases involving children to ensure cases are handled appropriately and that civil matters are not handled as criminal matters; may negotiate dropping of potential criminal charges against a child where the severity of the charge and the welfare of the child permit;
- May supervise clerical staff or lead other attorneys.
