THE POSITION

The Deputy Director - Building Inspection, is responsible for leading, managing, directing and administering the programs, budgets, functions and activities of the Building Inspection Division of the Community Development Department, including helping to ensure compliance with local, state and federal requirements, regulations and policies. The incumbent models a strong work ethic and leadership skills, including accountability for oneself and others. The incumbent may act in the absence of the Director of Community Development. The Deputy Director - Building Inspection is a single-position, at-will class that is exempt from the San Joaquin County Civil Service System. The incumbent serves as the chief Building Official.

THE DEPARTMENT

The Community Development Department consists of three divisions: Planning/Development Services, Neighborhood Preservation/Fiscal, and Building Inspection.

The Planning/Development Services Division assists the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors in the areas of comprehensive planning and community development. This duty includes preparing, maintaining and implementing the General Plan, as mandated by Government Code 65100 et seq.

The Neighborhood Preservation/Fiscal Division administers federal block grants and ensures compliance with regulations, initiates new programs and monitors activities in six Urban County jurisdictions, manages the county's Continuum of Care process, and prepares federal and state funding applications.

The Building Inspection Division protects the public's health and safety by regulating new building construction, inspecting existing buildings, investigating fires, and by reviewing and regulating all new development projects, as provided for in local and state law.

ARTS & CULTURE

Stockton Civic Theater, Bob Hope Theatre, Lodi's Hutchins Street Square, Tracy's Grand Theater, Concerts in the Park, the local colleges and many galleries. RECREATION

San Joaquin County government operates nine community parks for boating, hiking, camping, picnicking, swimming and organized sports. The Downtown Stockton Arena and

Ballpark, local college teams and sports complexes throughout the county provide both athletes and fans the chance to enjoy sporting events.

Enjoy the beauty of Lodi Lake Park and Nature Area and the Woodbridge Ecological Reserve. Micke Grove Park offers a zoo, amusement park, the Japanese Garden and the San Joaquin County Historical

Museum to delight both children and adults.

The Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta offers the best boating in the state: more than 1,000 miles of waterways stretching from the Stockton Marina to north of Sacramento and offering access to the San Francisco Bay.

AGRICULTURE

The county is one of the most agriculturally rich regions in California and is the number one producer, statewide, of asparagus. Twenty-four thousand acres of county farmland is dedicated to production of this crop. Weekly farmers markets throughout the county offer an abundance of fresh fruit and vegetables and artisanal goods. Fruit stands and pick-your-own produce farms dot the countryside. In recent years, the leading crop in the county has been wine grapes. Over 80 wineries within the Lodi Appellation offer opportunities for tasting and special events.





EDUCATION

From preschool to higher education, the county has an abundant array of public or private opportunities to learn and grow. The University of the Pacific, California State University. Stanislaus - Stockton Center, Humphreys College and Law School, and San Joaquin Delta Community College offer a wide variety of educational choices. The county's 14 school districts and 200 school sites provide families with a wide choice for children's educational development, including traditional schools, charter schools and alternative education, in addition to an excellent selection of private educational institutions.

HOUSING

TYPICAL DUTIES

- Plans, develops, organizes and directs comprehensive programs of building inspection and enforcement, and assists in planning and supervising the work of subordinate inspectors engaged in the inspection of buildings being constructed, altered, or repaired to determine conformance with approved plans, specifications, zoning laws, ordinances, codes and state laws
- Confers with Director of Community Development, professional and technical personnel and the public regarding building inspections operations and procedures; directs the development and implementation of program policies and procedures; analyzes and interprets existing and proposed local, state and federal legislation, policies, procedures and other directives to determine impact on assigned operations
- Serves as chief Building Official, may personally review plans for conformity to specifications, zoning laws, ordinances, codes, and state laws; investigates complaints and makes reports; issues cease and desist orders
- Participates in budget preparation and administration of expenditures; evaluates short- and long-term planning for the division
- Interprets plans, specifications, zoning laws, ordinances, codes and state laws for the public and subordinates; assists, directs and converses with the public at the counter or on telephone
- Through subordinate managers and supervisors, oversees and directs the activities of departmental staff; selects staff, monitors staff work activities; evaluates performance, reviews and takes action on disciplinary matters
- Schedules and conducts staff meetings and training sessions; assists in training and orienting new personnel
- Attends meetings and provides recommendations on matters germane to areas of assignment; participates in conference and seminars as required
- Effectively utilizes technology to improve systems and processes.

IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will possess:

- A bachelor's degree in business or public administration, engineering, architecture, or a construction-related field
- Five years of responsible senior-level building inspection experience in a public agency with responsibility for performing building inspection work, including two years in a supervisory capacity with responsibility for building code conformity
- An International Code Council Certification (ICC) in one or more of the following categories: Building Inspector, Electrical Inspector, Mechanical Inspector or Plumbing Inspector
- Ability to possess an ICC Certified Building Official (CBO) Uniform Codes Certificate within one year from the date of appointment
- Knowledge of the methods and techniques of regional planning; legal procedures in connection with County planning and zoning; building and zoning codes and related laws and ordinances; civil engineering, economics, sociology and architecture as they apply to regional planning; national, state, and local laws relating to planning procedures
- Knowledge of programs of governmental and private agencies affecting community planning; principles of effective supervision and personnel management; effective staff education and training techniques; project management; customer service; modern office automation technology and software relevant to assigned operations
- The ability to plan, assign, and direct the department activities in a cost-effective manner, while ensuring excellent customer service; exercise good judgment and make sound managerial decisions; provide appropriate and effective leadership and management of diverse staff teams, including subordinate managers and supervisors; work collaboratively with staff, other departments, and pertinent stakeholders to achieve successful outcomes
