The Public Health Services campus is located in Stockton, California. The health department provides a culturally diverse community (685,660) with classic public health services.

The department has a tradition of strong community involvement and leadership in health promotion.

This position provides support for all programs in Public Health Services. Programs include communicable disease, maternal & child health, and chronic disease. The position also supports health data needs of the broader community.



THE POSITION

This position in San Joaquin County Public Health Services provides an exciting career opportunity in epidemiology. The position offers a breadth of involvement in Public Health Services' programs and work with community organizations.

The Epidemiologist is responsible for performing investigative and analytical work including the development and maintenance of data systems for surveillance, and identification and analysis of public health issues to support the various programs in the department.

Typical duties:

- Develop and implement surveillance systems; maintain automated systems for collection, compilation and analysis of data, including data from local and state data sets.
- Monitor communicable and chronic disease trends.
- Review findings of investigations, interpret results and prepare reports.
- Design and conduct epidemiological studies.
- Prepare written reports including graphs and charts; develop and give presentations.
- Serve as a resource and technical consultant on epidemiology to the department, public officials, and other local and state community providers.
- May assist with writing grant funding proposals.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

EITHER PATTERN I

Education: Possession of a bachelor's degree in public health, epidemiology, biostatistics or a related public health field from an accredited college or university with coursework in both epidemiology and biostatistics.

Experience: Two years of experience in designing and conducting epidemiological investigations or studies and interpreting epidemiological or demographic data.

OR PATTERN II

Education: Possession of a master's degree in epidemiology or biostatistics or a related public health field from an accredited college or university (with a minimum of one year of course work in epidemiology and one year in biostatistics).

AND

License: Possession of a valid California driver's license.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION

The competitive process includes submittal of completed San Joaquin County Employment Application and responses to Supplemental Questions. Resumes will not be accepted in lieu of the required application materials. Completed application package must be submitted to the Human Resources Division.
