

The Medical Therapy Program of California Children's Services

The Medical Therapy Program (MTP) is a specialized program within California Children's Services that includes Occupational Therapy (OT) and Physical Therapy (PT) for children birth to 21 years old with eligible conditions including but not limited to: cerebral palsy, spina bifida, and muscular dystrophy. Therapy services are provided at outpatient rehabilitation units located in public schools. These units are called "Medical Therapy Units" (MTU).

MTU is open from 8:00am-4:30pm M-F at four locations: Lodi, Stockton, Manteca, Tracy.

THE POSITION

The Occupational Therapist Senior is a senior class level in the Occupational Therapy series and performs occupational therapy evaluations and treatment planning on children birth to 21 with physical disabilities in a Medical Therapy Unit. Typical duties for this full-time position include:

- Performs occupational therapy evaluations and interprets findings.
- Plans and implements occupational therapeutic treatment for patients; establishes appropriate treatment goals.
- Coordinates treatment programs with physicians, nurses, professional and para-professional staff.
- Attends staff meetings and patient conferences; conducts and/ or attends in-service education programs for a variety of departmental personnel; may assist with departmental orientation of new staff.

CALIFORNIA CHILDREN'S SERVICES

CCS is a statewide program that manages, directs and pays for medical care, equipment, and rehabilitation, when these services are authorized by the program. Services can be authorized for children and young adults less than 21 years of age who have eligible medical conditions and whose families are unable to pay for all or part of their care. CCS defines eligibility and selects the most qualified professionals to treat the child's CCS eligible condition.

EITHER PATTERN I

Experience: One year of experience as a licensed Occupational Therapist in San Joaquin County.

Experience: Two years of progressively responsible experience as a licensed Occupational Therapist performing diagnostic and/or therapeutic occupational therapy techniques for a variety of disabling conditions.

Licenses: Possess and maintain a current California license as an Occupational Therapist issued by the California Board of Occupational Therapy.
