San Joaquin County Public Health Services is recruiting for an experienced, dynamic and motivated Senior Public Health Nutritionists to fill current and future vacancies in Public Health programs. The current vacancy is in the WIC program within Public Health Services. The WIC program is a supplemental nutrition program serving Women, Infants and Children. This program serves 10,500 diverse clients in San Joaquin County including the cities of Stockton, Manteca and Tracy.

In this full-time position, the Senior public Health Nutritionist will directly supervise paraprofessional staff, provide WIC nutrition counseling, provide breastfeeding support, lead WIC clinics, and work on projects such as designing participant-centered nutrition classes, developing staff training and mentoring staff.

Become a Sr. Public Health Nutritionist

As a **Senior Public Health Nutritionist**, This is the registered, supervisory level in the Public Health Nutritionist series. Incumbents in this class perform the full range of nutritionist duties.

Incumbents also supervise support staff and assist with the training of the trainee and first level registered Public Health Nutritionists.

Sr. Public Health Nutritionist

Typical Duties

- Supervises, assigns, trains, reviews work, and evaluates assigned staff; assists in selection of staff; may develop and present in-service training
- Assesses nutritional needs of clients in an assigned program; monitors and evaluates nutritional services; counsels clients with specific food and nutritional needs.
- Develops, implements, and promotes nutritional programs and services; interprets and implements federal and state food and nutrition program guidelines; reviews policies and procedures and makes recommendations.
- Develops and implements nutrition education programs for individuals, families and groups; presents classes to clients; prepares and evaluates nutritional education materials and interprets its use in local health programs; may provide assistance in vendor education.
- Serves as a resource person to agency staff on nutritional problems and issues; coordinates with and assists staff in understanding client needs and carrying out program services.
- Assists in assessing agency needs; assists in the development of nutrition plans; plans and conducts studies and surveys relating to nutritional status, dietary patterns and food needs of target population groups; gathers and analyzes data and makes program recommendations.
- Within a specified program, may provide breastfeeding support, education and counseling to clients.
