THE DEPARTMENT

San Joaquin County Public Health Services is located in Stockton, CA and is a division of the Health Care Services Department. To promote a healthy future for a culturally diverse population of nearly 700,000, Public Health Services offers innovative, quality health services to the residents of San Joaquin County. THE PROGRAM

Child Health & Disability Prevention (CHDP) is a health promotion and disease prevention program providing eligible infants, children, and teens with comprehensive, periodic preventive health assessments at no cost. Preventive health assessments include testing for anemia, lead, pregnancy, tuberculosis (TB), and STDs, immunizations, oral exams and Denti-Cal services, vision and hearing screenings, and health education for patients and parents.

The **Health Care Program for Children in Foster Care (HCPCFC)** is a CHDP public health nursing program that provides public health nurse expertise in meeting the medical, dental mental, and developmental needs of children and youth in foster care.

The **Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (CLPP)** is a CHDP program that increases awareness regarding the hazards of lead exposure, reducing lead exposure, and increasing the number of children tested for lead poisoning. The program offers home visits, environmental home inspections and nutritional assessments to families of children found to be lead-poisoned. Information and education to the general public, medical providers and community-based organizations is also provided.

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TYPICAL DUTIES

- Plans, organizes and supervises the work of staff in assigned programs; selects, assigns, trains, and evaluates assigned staff; provides guidance and direction on complex nursing issues.
- Works with community groups to develop health services and educational programs; coordinates program services; reviews new and pending legislation and regulations to assess impact to programs and recommend changes.
- Conducts orientations and in-service training for program providers, new program staff, and other public health program staff.
- Assists with the preparation and revision of public health program plans and/or budgets; may recommend revisions to interagency agreements as necessary; may prepare and administer grants and funding requests; collects data and maintains records, insuring confidentiality of medical information; develops information and prepares reports.
- Insures proper patient follow-up and counseling for clients referred for further diagnosis and treatment; may plan and conduct Public Health clinics.
- Directs public health nursing education and health counseling services in connection with the control and prevention of disease and adverse health conditions in community health programs through home visits, schools, clinics, conferences, and family health counseling.
- Provides health-related information to clients, family members, providers, social workers/case managers and others; researches health issues; serves as a special resource on health problems and issues related to an assigned program.
- Attends meetings and conferences to maintain current information on public health programs and issues.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Experience: Four years of increasingly responsible, post-bachelor's degree nursing experience, including three years of community-based nursing in a community health, public school, county public health, or comparable setting that includes work in areas such as communicable disease response/prevention, health education, public health emergency planning, or community-based nursing case management.

License: Possession of a valid license to practice as a Registered Nurse in the State of California, and possession of a valid California Driver License.

Certificate: Possession of a California State Public Health Nursing Certificate.
