Education

From preschool to higher education, the County has it covered with an abundant array of public or private opportunities to learn and grow. The University of the Pacific, California State University, Stanislaus-Stockton Center, Humphreys College and Law School, National University, and the San Joaquin Delta Community College offer a wide variety of choices for educational opportunities. The County's 17 school districts provide families with a wide choice for children's educational development.



Agriculture

The county is one of the most agriculturally rich regions in California. Almonds are the leading commodity with over 104,000 bearing acres. Milk, grapes, walnuts, and cherries round out the top crops, with an abundance of other produce. Grapes make up 91,000 bearing acres, much of which are wine grapes. There are over 85 wineries within the Lodi Appellation offer opportunities for tasting and special events.

Information Systems Assistant Director

Typical Duties

This is a general guideline. Responsibilities and duties assigned may expand beyond those identified.

- Assist the Director in planning, organizing and coordinating Information Systems Division and Communications Division services.
- Administers, manages and coordinates the daily operational projects and activities of the division. Assumes full responsibility for the division in the absence of the Director.
- Through subordinate supervisors, directs and evaluates the systems and programming work of the division. Ensures that all objectives and commitments are met.
- Ensures application reliability, security, performance, and data integrity and disaster recovery functions.
- Evaluates new developments in the IT industry and communicates to customers (departments) potential benefits which may be realized.
- Implements and encourages the strategic direction for Information Technology including consultative services on a countywide basis to improve operational effectiveness of information technology.
- Initiates projects to review, evaluate, recommend and implement approved changes in technology or service practices to improve the efficiency of the division.
- Develops training plans and programs to promote the development of staff for the benefit of the County.

Desirable Qualifications

Education: Graduation from an accredited four year college or university with a Bachelor's Degree in computer science, public or business administration, or a closely related field.

Experience: Four years of experience in a management capacity which included managing large-scale, complex information systems and implementing complex, advanced information technology projects.
